SMALL AREA STATISTICS (WARD LIBRARY STATISTICS) SCALES A AND D

Prior to the 1961 Census, all Census statistics were published, usually at local authority level and above.

This was the first census for which unpublished statistics were produced for very small areas. These statistics could be purchased for areas down to the lowest Census area level ie Enumeration District (a convenient size area designated by Census Planning for realistic enumeration).

These statistics were presented in two sections, Scales 'A' and 'D', 100% and 10% respectively and are available in paper copy format at a cost of 16p per page. Attached are examples of these sheets and the Explanatory Notes that accompany them.

There is however, only limited coverage for England and Wales, because the statistics were only produced at customers request. The statistics can be purchased from the following address and details of the coverage will be supplied on request:

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Scale 'A' has been produced in five sections, with a page in each section for the required Wards, Civil Parishes or Enumeration Districts. Details of the Ward, Civil Parish or Enumeration District head each separate area, the % sign shown in the Ward and Civil Parish heading should be ignored. Where relevant the heading also shows whether the section relates to the part of a Ward or Parish within or outside a New Town or Conurbation Centre.

Section I
Lines 1 to 8
(on left)

shows for each tenure category the number of households and the number of persons enumerated in them and the number of rooms occupied.

Lines 12-15
(On left)

gives the sub-division of permanent dwellings according to the type of building of which they form part, with the total of occupied household spaces, persons enumerated therein and rooms contained. A definition of the building types is given at the head of Section

Lines 1-12
(Centre)

shows sex and country of birth, Residents of England and Wales born outside the UK except that the figure for Ireland includes persons born in both Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

Lines 13-17
(Centre)

shows Nationality or Citizenship of Residents of England and Wales sex born outside the British Isles. Persons with Nationality not stated are included with "Other aliens".

Lines 1-22
(on right)

gives population enumerated in various types of institutional households (not hotels) by sex, separating (where appropriate) inmates and the remainder.

Lines 21-32
(On left)

shows tabulation of households according to their possession of household arrangements, the number of households with exclusive use of all four arrangements, the numbers sharing and without each of the arrangements; households sharing a dwelling "SHG HSDS" are shown and within these those without exclusive use of a stove and sink "SHG KTCH" are shown separately.

Line 23
(Centre)

gives persons of each sex of pensionable age (males aged 65 and over and females aged 60 and over) enumerated alone.

Lines 25-32
(Centre)

shows households of two persons with one or both of pensionable age divided into: married couples, two males, two females, others sub-divided according to the sex of the elder. The total "Male Old" includes cases where both are the same age.

Lines 27-43
(on right)

gives population enumeration in hotels split into staff, relatives of staff, resident guests and visitor guests; numbers of hotels in different size categories.

- Lines 27-42
(Extreme right) shows population enumerated outside private households by sex in quinquennial age-groups up to 65 and over.
- Lines 37-42
(on left) shows distribution of households and of the persons in them according to the number of persons per room with separate lines for households sharing a dwelling, with exclusive use of stove and sink "WITH KTCH" and those sharing a dwelling without exclusive use of stove and sink "SHG KTCH".
- Lines 36-42
(Centre) gives figures by sex of persons with a usual residence outside the Local Authority area of enumeration distinguishing visitors from elsewhere in England and Wales and from outside England and Wales. For Local Authority areas split by New Town or Conurbation Centre boundaries the parts of the Local Authority area within and outside the New Town or Conurbation Centre are treated as separate Local Authority areas.
- Lines 44-68
(on left and centre) gives population by sex and marital condition in quinquennial age-groups.
- Lines 44-69
(on right) shows population aged under 21 by single years of age.
- Lines 50-60
(on right) gives number of households sharing a dwelling by number of persons (1 to 7 and over) in each sharing household.
- Section II
County Table 11 provides a tabulation of dwelling according to the number of household spaces and the number of rooms within them.
- Section III
County Table 11 continued a continuation of Table 11 (see above) cols. L to R
- Section IV
County Table 13 provides a tabulation of households according to the number of rooms they occupy and the number of persons present there on Census night.
- Section V
County Table 22 gives a tabulation of dwellings according to their possession of household arrangements. Line 7 is 2 unshared perm. dwellings are restricted to Building Types 2 and 3.
- In Wales only there is a 6th Section which shows numbers of persons speaking Welsh only and those speaking both Welsh and English by sex, in 7 age-groups.
- Terms and abbreviations are explained in the General Explanatory Notes enclosed under these tabulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- Line 1 gives the totals of males, females and households in the sample.
- Line 2 shows the number of persons in the sample enumerated at their usual residence by (a) those working outside the local authority area of residence and (b) those working within the area of usual residence. Workers away include those resident workers who work within the conurbation centre or New Town, as well as those outside the Area.
- Line 3-6 (Left) shows for males, single females and other females the numbers in four age groups who are economically active ie in employment or out of employment.
- Lines 3-5 (Right) shows the numbers of males and females out of employment.
- Lines 7-9 shows persons in employment of each sex in the following orders of the Standard Industrial Classification.

Line 19

shows households divided into those containing no family, one family, two or more families.

The figures supplied on Scale D are based on the questions answered by 10 per cent of the population. The sample figure for an item can therefore differ from the true value of that item simply due to sampling. A difference either way of twice the "standard error" may be expected about once in 20 times. For the bulk of the population or household items the "standard error" can be taken as roughly equal to the square root of that item.
